

Note: This is a preliminary and tentative list of programs as of May 1, 2012. Please check with each site before registering for cancellations, rescheduled dates, and additional sessions.

All programs require pre-registration and prepayment. Fee for each program is \$5/scout, unless otherwise noted. Siblings over age 6 may attend for \$5/child, but they must be registered in advance. These programs are not appropriate for children under age 6. There are no refunds for cancellations, however substitutes are permitted.

Scouts must be accompanied by leaders and/or parent chaperones. There is never a charge for these adults. Adult:scout ratios required by the BSA are required for all clinics. Tiger Cub programs include scout plus adult partner, as outlined by the BSA.

Maximum total attendance numbers for each program are established by each facility based on the space available. Program maximum and minimum numbers are published with registration material for each facility.

Scouts should arrive dressed for the weather and ready to participate in fun, hands-on learning. Programs involve a combination of learn-at-your-pace stations and educator-lead activities. Programs will run regardless of the weather, with adaptations made to accommodate outdoor conditions.

Registering for any Fox Valley Scout Program Collaboration clinic implies consent for collaborator use of any photographs taken during the clinic. Leaders/parents must advise the clinic leader at least one week before the clinic if there are exceptions/.

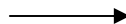
